Find out about learning a new craft or perhaps you would like to teach us one.


No experience necessary and we often have guest tutors to get us started.

Keep safe – avoid becoming a victim of “scams”

PC Mark Towler of Sutton South Neighbourhood Team gave a talk to the group on the “10 Golden Rules to Prevent Fraud”. These are:

1. **Never** give banking or personal details (i.e. pin number, name and address) to anyone you do not know or trust. This information is valuable so make sure you protect it.
2. **Always** check that the person contacting you, who might use the phone or call in person, is genuine. Call your bank or building society to check on them.
3. Be suspicious of all “too good to be true” offers and deals. There are no guaranteed get-rich-quick schemes.
4. Do not agree to offers or deals immediately.
5. Insist on time to obtain independent or legal advice before making a decision.
6. Do not hand over money or sign anything until you have checked the credentials of the company or individual.
7. Never send money to anyone you don't know or trust, whether in the UK or abroad, or use methods of payment that you're not comfortable with.
8. Always log on to a website directly, rather than clicking on links provided in an email.
9. Do not rely solely on glowing testimonials. Find solid, independent evidence of a company's success.
10. Always get independent or legal advice if an offer involves money, time or commitment.

Remember that large companies such as Microsoft, Talk Talk etc will not ring you personally to tell you that your computer is faulty. If you get a call from anyone purporting to be from a large multi-national company hang up!

Computers & the Internet.. here's why you should bother!

Getting to grips with the 'Digital Jungle' can be daunting at first. But with the right support and some perseverance, you'll soon discover the many benefits that come from getting online and using digital devices, like these users did.

Keep in touch with family & friends – one learner who described herself as “not very digitally minded” was taught how to use the Internet and Skype - an online video chat tool. She regularly speaks with her brother, who lives abroad and who is not very well, giving them both a lot of joy at being able to speak to each other.
