## Did you know?

That there is a late Georgian Grade 2\* listed Mansion in Nonsuch Park?


The ground floor of the Mansion House is used by a catering company for receptions, weddings, parties and other events. The same company operates the cafe in the former Servants Hall, called The Pantry.



The Service Wing has been renovated by the Friends Of Nonsuch and is now a Museum, showing how it would have been in the mid 19<sup>th</sup> Century. This has a dairy, sculleries, kitchen, larders and laundries, together with an exhibition room in the Loose Box and a shop in the Stables. There is also the Nonsuch Palace Gallery, which has a model of Henry VIII's Nonsuch Palace – built between 1538 and 1547 and demolished in 1682 – and tells the story of the people who lived in the Palace and about the excavation in 1959 that uncovered the site.

The Gallery is open from 11 am to 2 pm every Sunday throughout the winter – admission £2.50 for adults – members and children under 16 free.

The Museum and Gallery are both open on Sundays during the summer months – please see the website: <u>www.friendsofnonsuch.co.uk</u> for times of opening.

### How to Be Safe and Sure at Your Door

Sutton is one of the safest Boroughs in London and Sutton South is one of its safest wards. You can help keep it that way.

Sutton council and police, through their joint Safer Sutton Partnership Service, offer a range of advice on how to "Be safe and sure at your door".

They can provide a simple pack which includes all sorts of advice on dealing with doorstep traders, home security, fire safety and home handyperson schemes.

One of the great ideas in the pack helps to tackle the rare but upsetting crime of distraction burglary, where a criminal can get into your home through false pretences, and distracts the resident while their accomplice carries out the burglary. The nominated neighbour scheme helps people who may not be confident in dealing with unknown callers. You can display a simple laminated card giving the details of a nominated neighbour who will check the details of callers. Residents will not allow anyone into their home unless their neighbour has checked they are who they say are.

Like most good ideas it is simple. Genuine callers will not mind having their details checked.
